John Wycliffe (1324-1384)

While many give credit to Martin Luther as the first Reformation pastor-theologian, John Wycliffe may rightly be considered the first great reformer in prelude to the 16th century. This is why many aptly call him "the Morning Star of the Reformation." Founder of the Lollard movement, which was a precursor to the Reformation period, Wycliffe was a preacher, Bible translator, and university scholar who took issue with many unbiblical practices and doctrines of the Roman Catholic Church. Yet, his greatest contribution came in his leadership role in translating the Bible from the Latin Vulgate into the English vernacular so that more of God's people may encounter their Savior in His Word. The Wycliffe English Bible in its beauty and structure would influence the English language for centuries until the translation of the King James Bible in 1611.
