Martin Luther (1483-1546)

Perhaps no one is more singularly important in the history of western civilization than the German Augustinian monk, Martin Luther. Estranged from his own earthly father, Luther would feel a great gulf between his heavenly Father and himself. He was not assured that the sacraments of the church and his own good works were sufficient before his Maker. For Luther, Romans 1:17 ("The just shall live by faith.") brought a spiritual and theological revolution to his soul and mind. As an academic, Luther began writing tracts and works on justification by faith alone, abuses of the Roman Catholic Church, and indulgences. Both his life and the life of Europe would change in 1517 when he nailed his *95 Theses* to the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, essentially being the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. Luther would eventually be declared a heretic after defending his position before Emperor Charles V at the Diet of Worms where he boldly declared, "I stand convicted by the Scriptures to which I have appealed, and my conscience is taken captive by God's word, I cannot and will not recant anything, for to act against our conscience is neither safe for us, nor open to us." His preaching, commentaries, tracts, translation of the Latin Bible into common German, and his outsized personality made this man enormously influential in his day. Moreover, Luther's reformation would also greatly influence the political structure of western civilization, making Americans the beneficiaries of this monk.

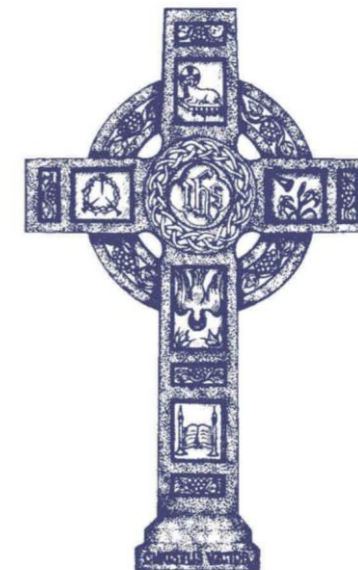
