John Knox (1510-1572)

The founding of Reformation-era Presbyterianism in many ways may be traced back to the great Scottish clergyman, John Knox. A former French galley slave (persecuted for his Protestant beliefs), he became an influential man in many circles. The great Scotsman would serve as chaplain to King Edward VI and would have some part in the shaping of the text of the Anglican Church's *Book of Common Prayer*. He would spend time with other Protestant exiles in Calvin's Geneva, learning under the greatest mind of the Reformation period. His return to Scotland led to Knox becoming the leader of the Reformation in the Church of Scotland. He was a primary author of the Scots' Confession, and was known to pray "Lord, give me Scotland or I die." He opposed Mary, Queen of Scots, and would be a regular thorn in her side until his death. Knox's views about liberty and opposing tyrannical governments would influence the Puritans and even the American colonies.
